The ASU-Heber Springs center is comprised of both traditional and non-traditional students, primarily from Cleburne County. Classes are held in the John L. Latimer Skills Training Center, a 25,000 square-foot facility located at 71 Cleburne Park Road in the industrial park, which boasts 11 classrooms, including a computer lab, a science lab, a multi-purpose lab, an interactive video classroom, learning center, bookstore, and administrative offices.

Full-time and adjunct faculty provide instruction to over 440 students for core curriculum classes as well as business-oriented courses such as accounting and business statistics. Concurrent enrollment is also available, allowing high school students to enroll in university courses (see page 16 for more information). Additionally, ASU-Heber Springs offers continuing education courses, from photography to financial investment, and specialized training for industry.

DEGREES OFFERED

The following ASU-Beebe degrees are offered at the Heber Springs Center:

Associate of Arts

for students planning to transfer to a 4-year institution in most majors, including business. See page 43 for degree plan.

Associate of Arts in Teaching

for students planning to transfer to a 4-year institution to earn a bachelor's degree in teaching. See page 96 for degree plan.

Associate of Science in Health Science

for students planning to transfer to a 4-year institution to earn a bachelor's degree in a health-related major. See page 89 for degree plan.

ADVISING SERVICES

Academic advising is required before an admitted student may register for classes. Advisors at ASU-Heber Springs include full-time faculty and selected staff members. These advisors guide students in the selection of the most appropriate courses for students' academic goals.

Disability services and other counseling needs are coordinated through the Counseling Center at ASU-Beebe.

LEARNING CENTER

Located in room 106, the Learning Center provides individual and computerized tutoring to assist students in becoming more efficient, effective learners. Computers are available for student use with Internet access. Also available is access to a number of on-line Abington Library resources, including databases and subscriptions. All services are free of charge and are on a first-come, first-serve basis-no appointment necessary.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

The goal of our Continuing Education department is to extend the resources of ASU-Heber Springs to meet educational needs and to provide public service for the citizens of the surrounding communities. Classes include computer software training, finance and investment seminars, and personal enrichment courses such as photography and conversational Spanish. Continuing Education is coordinated by the Director of Advancement.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

The Workforce Development Program serves as a link between the college and area businesses, industries, and government agencies. Our function is to provide educational and training opportunities to business, industry, government and the community in the college's service area.
