## HOME OF THE RAIDERS

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### **TUITION:**

When taking classes at a *High School Campus during school hours* there is a difference between the regular tuition rate and the concurrent tuition rate, this difference is an academic scholarship as required by Act 1451 of 2009. If a concurrent student takes the classes on an ASU-Beebe Campus regular tuition and fees will be charged. Students will be sent an income report 1098T for income tax purposes.

### **INSTRUCTORS:**

Riverview High School has employed instructors that are qualified to teach the college classes at the high school. The teachers are qualified the same way as an instructor on one of our ASU-Beebe campuses. They have their Master's Degree with at least 18 graduate hours in the course subject. Plus they are required to attend professional development sessions on one of the ASU-Beebe campuses at least once a year plus each course they teach will have a site-visit/review by an ASU-Beebe division chair or mentor each semester.

### **COURSES:**

Riverview High School and their qualified instructors have joined with ASU-Beebe to offer the courses below on the Riverview High School Campus:

#### **BIOL 1004    Biology for General Education**

**4 Credits**

Provide a study of the similarity and diversity of life on earth. This course is designed for non-majors **and will not count as the prerequisite** for any other BIOL, BOT or ZOO course. ACTS Course Number: BIOL 1004.

#### **ENG 1003    Freshman English I**

**3 Credits**

Instruction in expository essay form, structure, and style. **Prerequisite:** ACT scores of 19 or better on reading and English. ACTS Course Number: ENGL 1013.

#### **ENG 1013    Freshman English II**

**3 Credits**

A continuation of ENG 1003 with the addition of research papers and literary genres.

**Prerequisite:** ENG 1003. ACTS Course Number: ENGL 1023.

#### **ENG 2003    World Literature I**

**3 Credits**

A study of literature from antiquity through the Renaissance, reflecting the major philosophical, religious, and literary trends of these time periods. **Prerequisite:** ENG 1013. ACTS Course Number: ENGL 2113.

#### **ENG 2013    World Literature II**

**3 Credits**

A continuation of ENG 2003, from the Renaissance to the present. **Prerequisite:** ENG 1013. ACTS Course Number: ENGL 2123.

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### Courses Continued:

#### **HIST 2763 The United States to 1876**

**3 Credits**

A survey of the development of social, political and economic institutions in the United States from the age of exploration and discovery to reconstruction. ACTS Course Number: HIST 2113.

#### **HIST 2773 The United States Since 1876**

**3 Credits**

A survey of changing social, political and economic policies in the United States from reconstruction to the present. ACTS Course Number: HIST 2123.

#### **MATH 1023 College Algebra**

**3 Credits**

A detailed study of functions and their applications including linear, quadratic, polynomial, rational, radical, absolute value, exponential, and logarithmic functions. Topics also include systems of equations and matrices. **Prerequisite:** Acceptable ACT score **OR** Compass score. ACTS Course Number: MATH 1103.

#### **MATH 1033 Plane Trigonometry**

**3 Credits**

A study of trigonometric functions, identities, basic logarithmic and exponential functions, conic sections, and complex numbers. **Prerequisite:** MATH 1023 with a grade of "C" or better. ACTS Course Number: MATH 1203.

#### **MATH 2233 Applied Statistics**

**3 Credits**

A study of elementary statistics for students in the biological, physical, or social sciences. **Prerequisite:** MATH 1023 with a grade of "C" or better. ACTS Course Number: MATH 2103.
