Accreditation

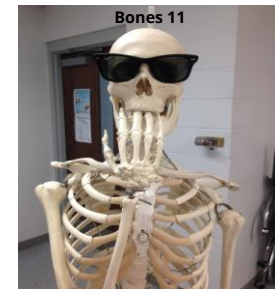

EMT-PARAMEDIC PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

The EMT-Paramedic program is open to all eligible applicants and requires:

- A high school diploma or equivalent
- Acceptable scores on placement tests
- Negative TB skin test
- Compliance with the Hepatitis B vaccine policy
- Proof of two MMR inoculations
- Proof of Arkansas EMT license **(Paramedic program only)**
