TUITION:

When taking classes at a *High School Campus during school hours* there is a difference between the regular tuition rate and the concurrent tuition rate, this difference is an academic scholarship as required by Act 1451 of 2009. If a concurrent student takes the classes on an ASU-Beebe Campus regular tuition and fees will be charged. Students will be sent an income report 1098T for income tax purposes.

INSTRUCTORS:

Mayflower High School has employed instructors that are qualified to teach the college classes at the high school. The teachers are qualified the same way as an instructor on one of our ASU-Beebe campuses. They have their Master's Degree with at least 18 graduate hours in the course subject. Plus they are required to attend professional development sessions on one of the ASU-Beebe campuses at least once a year plus each course they teach will have a site-visit/review by an ASU-Beebe division chair or mentor each semester.

COURSES:

Mayflower High School and their qualified instructors have joined with ASU-Beebe to offer the courses below on the Mayflower High School Campus:

BIOL 1004 Biology for General Education 4 Credits

Provide a study of the similarity and diversity of life on earth. This course is designed for non-majors and **will not count as the prerequisite** for any other BIOL, BOT or ZOOLOGY course. ACTS Course Number: BIOL 1004.

MATH 1023 College Algebra 3 Credits

A detailed study of functions and their applications including linear, quadratic, polynomial, rational, radical, absolute value, exponential, and logarithmic functions. Topics also include systems of equations and matrices. **Prerequisite:** Acceptable ACT score **OR** Compass score. ACTS Course Number: MATH 1103.

SPCH 1203 Oral Communications 3 Credits

A basic speech course in which an understanding of the fundamentals of communication theory and a proficiency in the use of oral communication skills are developed. The course also serves as a **prerequisite** for all other speech courses unless exemption is granted by the division. ACTS Course Number: SPCH 1003.

THEA 2503 Fine Arts-Theatre 3 Credits

Introduction to the creative process and history of theatre. Provides students with an appreciation of how various artistic elements combine to produce theatrical presentations. Students will explore the human experience through the theatre arts. ACTS Course Number: DRAM 1003.
