

PROGRAM INFORMATION

ASU-Beebe offers both Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) and Paramedic Level Training through the Emergency Medical Services Program. The coursework for this program prepares students for the National Licensure Exam.

Career opportunities exist for EMT and Paramedics in North Central Arkansas. These include augmenting the current hospital shortage as emergency department technicians, as well as opportunities with ambulance services, police and fire departments, medical centers, and industry.

EMT classes are held during the week (Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday) at night. EMT classes are offered each Fall (August) and Spring (January) and last one semester. Paramedic classes are held on Monday and Friday from 9:00-4:00. Paramedic cohorts begin in July of each year and are completed in July of the following year.

PROGRAM APPLICATION

To apply for the Paramedic program a student must first complete the EMT program and have their EMT Licensure. Application information for both programs can be found on the ASU-Beebe Website.

Paramedic Program applications due May 1 with classes beginning in July.
