### **Sex Crimes Prevention Act**

In response to the Campus Sex Crimes Act ( Public Law 106-386), institutions of higher education are required to advise the campus community where law enforcement agency information provided by the State concerning registered sex offenders may be obtained. The University Police Department will provide this information at (501) 882-8851.

#### **Procedure to follow if a Sex Offense Occurs**

- DON'T: Destroy evidence by bathing, douching, washing hands, or changing clothes or linens.
- DO: Notify someone immediately to go with you to the police or hospital. Call Police as soon as possible. Even if you don't want to file charges, you can file an information report that may help police locate your attacker and protect others.
- DO: Take a change of clothes with you to the hospital.
- DO: Write down details about the offender and the circumstances of the rape as soon as possible.
