



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR ARTICULATION OF STUDENTS

University of Arkansas at Monticello

AND

Arkansas State University-Beebe

Associate of Science in Education

to

Bachelor of Science in Education Studies

This Memorandum of Understanding ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas, acting on behalf of the **University of Arkansas at Monticello** (hereinafter, UAM), located at 346 University Drive, Monticello, AR 71656 and Arkansas State University-Beebe (hereinafter, ASUB), located at 1000 lowa Street, Beebe, AR 72012.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to facilitate the transfer and degree completion of students earning the Associate of Science in Education at Arkansas State University-Beebe to the Bachelor of Science in Education Studies Non-Licensure degree program at UAM. Through collaborative efforts, UAM and Arkansas State University-Beebe desire to provide clarity regarding the degree requirements herein, thereby affording students the opportunity to earn a high-quality degree from both institutions in the most efficient manner possible.

AGREEMENT

It is agreed that any student who has earned the Associate of Science in Education with designated Education classes at Arkansas State University-Beebe will be admitted to the Bachelor of Science in Education Studies Non-Licensure program at UAM with full junior classification, subject to the provisions listed below.

1. Arkansas State University-Beebe will offer the courses listed on the "Associate of Science in Education" degree plan.





- 2. University of Arkansas at Monticello will accept up to 69 credit hours completed, with grades of "C" or higher without prejudice.
- 3. University of Arkansas at Monticello will offer the remainder of courses for students to achieve the appropriate Bachelor of Science in Education Studies Non-Licensure degree.
- 4. After completion of the BSES, students must complete an alternative route teaching program to receive a teaching license. University of Arkansas at Monticello's alternative teaching route is the Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) program. The MAT program will allow Bachelor of Science in Educational Studies Non-Licensure degree students to seek licensure in K-6 Elementary Education, Middle Childhood grades 4-8, Secondary grades 7-12, Physical Education, Art, and Music K-12.

ADMISSION AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- A. The student will have earned the Associate of Science in Education at Arkansas State University-Beebe with at least a 2.0 GPA cumulative grade point average, on or after the Effective Date of this Agreement.
- B. The student must complete the requirements necessary for general admission to UAM.
- C. Degree Program admission requirement for students who transfer pursuant to this Agreement will be determined in the same manner as if their initial enrollment had been at UAM.
- D. Program admission requirements may differ from college and university admission requirements.
- E. Admission to the university does not guarantee admission to a given program of study.

TRANSFER OF CREDITS

- A. Course requirements for this Agreement are displayed on the following attachment:
 - 2+2 Degree Plan Checklist: Arkansas State University-Beebe Associate of Science in Education to UAM Bachelor of Science Education Studies Non-Licensure degree.
- B. A transfer student who has not completed all courses specified within the Associate of Science in Education plan at Arkansas State University-Beebe, as stipulated on the above-referenced degree checklist, before entering UAM, must work with an academic advisor to ensure timely completing of degree program requirements.
- C. Remedial course grades will not be computed in the cumulative GPA for purposes of admission to UAM.
- D. UAM will accept the transfer of credits, up to a maximum of six, for "D" grades subject to the following conditions:





- i. The transfer of credits with "D" grades is available only to first-time entering transfer students at the time of admission to UAM.
- ii. The student must petition to receive credit for six hours of "D" grades of the student's choosing.
- iii. The student will select the appropriate six hours of "D" grades to transfer into UAM after consultation with his/her appointed academic advisor.
- iv. Prerequisite rules shall apply to transfer of credit with "D" grades in the same manner as they would for credits earned at UAM.
- E. Calculation of overall GPA for purposes of graduation and awarding of honors is left to the discretion of UAM.
- F. However, a "D" may be accepted in the admission process for being admitted to the university (UAM), but a "D" will not be accepted for admission into the BSES Non-Licensure program.

IMPLEMENTATION AND REVIEW

- A. The Chief Academic Officers at each institution will implement the terms of this Agreement, including incorporation of any mutually agreed upon changes into subsequent revisions of this Agreement, assuring compliance with UA System policy, procedure, and guidelines.
- B. This Agreement will be reviewed on a bi-annual basis, and UAM and Arkansas State University-Beebe will notify one another in a timely manner of any curriculum changes that would significantly impact the nature of this Agreement.
 - a. The first review period will be spring of 2024.
 - b. The School of Education for the University of Arkansas at Monticello and the Department of Education for Arkansas State University-Beebe will partner in the review and renewal process as directed above.
 - c. Effective Date of Agreement is January 1, 2023.
 - d. Termination Date of Agreement
 - i. Program will be subject to routine review.
 - ii. This agreement may be cancelled by either party with at least once academic year advance notification with clear plans to hold harmless (i.e. satisfy course offering expectations) any students, who are currently enrolled in the program and remain full-time in the program of study.
- C. UAM and Arkansas State University-Beebe will work together cooperatively, in the best interest of affected students, to resolve any issues related to the transfer of courses should changes to either degree program occur while the Agreement is in effect.





- D. Students will be subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement in accordance with their academic year of entry at Arkansas State University-Beebe. A student may opt for a subsequent revision of this Agreement but must meet all of the requirements specified therein.
- E. UAM and Arkansas State University-Beebe will make every effort to inform students of this Agreement. This may include, but is not limited to, inclusion within each institution's website, university catalog, recruitment publications, media announcements, social media engagement, and in-person information sessions.

MISCELLANEOUS

- A. Resources/Support Services Provided by each Institution
 - a. University of Arkansas at Monticello faculty and staff will share expertise with Arkansas State University-Beebe faculty and staff to maintain compatibility of its courses in the AS program.
 - b. Arkansas State University-Beebe is responsible for the quality of courses taught by its faculty.
 - c. University of Arkansas at Monticello is responsible for the quality of courses taught by its faculty.
- B. Recruitment Strategies
 - a. Faculty and staff of University of Arkansas at Monticello and Arkansas State University-Beebe will continue to actively promote and recruit new cohorts.
 - b. Recruiting activities will include such events as informational seminars presented on the Arkansas State University-Beebe campuses or remotely.
- C. This Agreement is effective upon execution and shall remain in effect even if persons, positions, and/or title changes.
- D. The Agreement may be terminated by either party with at least 60 calendar days written notice.
- E. If the Agreement is terminated, all students who have already been admitted to UAM, in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, will be allowed to complete their approved course of study under the terms contained therein.
