

Pathways to Early Childhood Education Careers

ASU-Beebe and the Teacher Education and Compensation Helps (T.E.A.C.H) Scholarship Program are providing a pathway to train students for a career in early childhood education.

During summer 2021, ASU-Beebe became a T.E.A.C.H Scholarship school. To be eligible for a T.E.A.C.H Scholarship, students must meet the following criteria:

Applicants must be employed at least 20 hours per week in a licensed childcare facility, state pre-K program, home-visiting program or family childcare home.

Applicants must be either currently applying to or admitted to an approved

degree/certificate/endorsement program in Early Childhood Education.

E.A.C.H. is currently waiving any income restrictions as well as the cap on the number of applicants from a single licensed site.

Scholarships are awarded based on need and commitment to the Early Childhood Education field. Students seeking the Child Development Associate certification, Technical Certificate or Associate of Applied Science in Early Childhood Education at ASU-Beebe may qualify for the T.E.A.C.H Scholarship. The T.E.A.C.H Early Childhood ® Scholarship Program pays for 90% of tuition and books, provides an \$110 travel stipend each semester, reimburses the student's sponsoring center for \$12.50 per hour of release time given up to six hours per week, provides \$450 in bonuses for teachers who complete their contract, a \$1,000 stipend to purchase a laptop or additional technology and provides counseling and administrative support for the program. For the spring 2022 semester, 18 students enrolled in ASU-Beebe's CDA classes qualified for the scholarship.



The application deadline is April 1, 2022 at 5 p.m. New and returning students are encouraged to apply for a variety of privately funded scholarships administered by the ASU-Beebe Office of Institutional Advancement.

Scholarships require evidence of scholastic achievement and/or outstanding ability in the area of the award. Scholarships vary in amounts and duration of award, with some being campus specific among the four ASU-Beebe campuses at Beebe, Heber Springs, Little Rock Air Force Base and Searcy.
