Art Gallery to Feature Couples Art Series During September

The ASU-Beebe Art Department will present this academic year's couples series *Couples that Create:* Carly Dahl & Dustyn Bork during September at the England Center Art Gallery.

"My work focuses on the ideas and ideals of beauty and unrealistic representations in society," Dahl said. "The figures within the artwork symbolize the pressure and idealized standards of beauty. These artworks examine the psychological pressures that the media and culture often perpetuate. The images feature blank faces inviting the viewer to see themselves or others as the subject matter."

"My paintings focus on the built environment," Bork said. "I experiment with abstracted forms and structures by lifting them from their original context. These works are akin to facades. They remove the compositions from built structures to quote the constructed landscape. This series symbolizes the beauty implicit in surfaces and structures in various levels of decay and renewal."

ASU-Beebe Awarded Over \$1 Million in Regional Workforce Grants

ASU-Beebe was recently awarded \$1,080,000 in Regional Workforce Grant Awards from the Arkansas Division of Higher Education.

The Computerized Machining and Industrial Technology programs on the Searcy campus will receive \$1 million, and the Computer Aided Drafting and Design program on the Beebe campus will receive \$80,000 toward the development of automation and robotics curriculum within the program.

ASU-Beebe Chancellor, Dr. Jennifer Methvin, made the announcement during a college forum. "We are grateful to the State of Arkansas for this funding to enable our instructors to provide the level of education and skills needed." Dr. Jason Goodner, Vice Chancellor for Academics, added, "The grants awarded will focus on providing workforce training to meet the needs of industry and companies in these high-tech fields."




