




## **Couples that Create Exhibit Closing Reception**

#### **Covid-19 Booster Clinics this Friday**

Campus locations, dates, and times are below:

**Beebe Clinic** – Friday, September 30, from 8 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. at the Student Center in the Walmart/Regions Room at 610 N. Pecan St in Beebe.

**Searcy Clinic** – Friday, September 30, from 11:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the Main Building, Room 117 at 1800 East Moore Avenue in Searcy.

**Heber Springs Clinic** – Friday, September 30, at 9 a.m. in the Academic Center, Room 100 at 101 River Crest Drive in Heber Springs.

The new boosters contain an updated formula that both boosts immunity against the original coronavirus strain and protects against the newer Omicron variants, including BA.4 and BA.5. The CDC estimates the BA.5 subvariant makes up nearly 89% of all new cases.

Pfizer's updated booster shot is recommended for everyone 12 and older, and Moderna's updated booster is recommended for adults 18 and older. The CDC recommends everyone who is eligible stay up to date on vaccinations by getting an updated booster dose at least 2 months after their last COVID shot or at least 3 months after a COVID infection.

Employees, their family members, and students are encouraged to receive the updated booster. Walkins are welcome; however, before receiving the vaccine, participants must complete a Covid-19 Immunization Consent Form, present their health insurance card, if they have insurance, and show their driver's license.

ASU-Beebe Chancellor Dr. Jennifer Methvin said, "As you consider if you will seek a Covid-19 vaccination, I encourage you to talk to your health care provider and to do some research, taking care to consult peer-reviewed and/or otherwise reliable sources. One helpful source of information might be the CDC's Facts about COVID-19 Vaccines page. Though I highly encourage everyone to take the vaccine unless specifically directed by your health care provider to do otherwise, at this time, being vaccinated is optional for all employees and students."
