Explanation of Four Semester Plan

This degree plan is a recommended plan of study which may require adjustments to fit individual situations such as semester course load, summer courses, transfer coursework, courses repeated or developmental courses required.

This plan should be used with a degree checksheet to ensure all requirements are met for completion of the degree. Students should meet with an assigned faculty advisor at least once a semester to ensure that the plan is appropriate for the desired academic path.

The Early Childhood Education (daycare) program prepares individuals to teach, administrate or establish a childcare center. The program prepares teachers to be facilitators and interactors to extend children's learning and to promote high level thinking and reasoning. The program prepares individuals to assume responsibilities in various jobs in the service areas. Some of these might include: child care instructor, director, owner, director of a family day home, or manager of a corporate child care facility.
